SO, WHAT'S GOING ON AT MY ALMA MATER?

Just as your alma mater is known for, it was another eventful year at Mayfield High School. From the day the seniors walked in the 10-12 doors for their last first day at Mayfield High School, it was a race to the finish while making the most of every moment along the way. The juniors prepared themselves for a year of hard work and becoming closer to leading the school. The sophomores, having a year "under their belts" started feeling more comfortable as students of the high school. The freshmen learned what high school truly is about, and the last group of eighth graders to walk the halls of Mayfield had an exciting year. The enthusiasm and school spirit never stopped and each class made a little more of a mark at Mayfield by accomplishing a variety of achievements for our school and community.

Mayfield obviously made some remarkable academic achievements throughout the year as evidenced by being named in the top 500 schools in the nation by Newsweek Magazine, . For a district to have back-to-back years with a student scoring a perfect score of 36 on the ACT is nearly unheard of. However, after **Corey Blackwell's** (senior) perfect score as a junior last year, **Evan Kominsky** (junior) followed it up this school year by scoring another perfect 36, continuing what seems to be a new tradition. Junior **Haley Spaner** was chosen as one of ten students in north eastern Ohio to study at Case Western Reserve for her senior year in a pre-medicine program. The Division C Science Olympiad team placed 5th at the NEO Regional tournament, where they qualified for the State Competition at The Ohio State University and placed 9th. Mayfield had four students recognized for the National Scholastic Art and Writing awards. **Brigid O'Donell** won silver for her art, **Maggie Cregan** won gold for her short story, and **Bobby Jurgelis** and **Bruce Walton** were recognized for their written columns. Mayfield announced at graduation that five students from the senior class were to be honored in the Academic Hall of Fame at Mayfield High School. These students include **Valedictorian Lance Sterle**, **Salutatorian Corey Blackwell**, **Ilya Gorodetskov**, **Philip House**, and **Andrew Haling**.

As always our student organizations and clubs put on some great dances, fundraisers, and more throughout the year. The formal dances always leave those who attend with great memories. The student council led by **Alyssa Kristosik**, **Pinkhas Avshalumov**, **Katie Oswald**, and **Mike Elliot** started the year off with a theme of "Night on the Nile" for our Homecoming Dance. **Olivia Young** was named Homecoming Queen with **Chuck Zaverella** as her King. Winter Formal rolled around soon after, where **Jen Tripi**, **Kate Radivoyevitch**, **Jackie Vance**, **Olivia Young**, and the rest of Cats Cabinet put on a "Fabulous 50's" formal dance. Here **Jen Tripi** was crowned Winter Formal Queen and **Mark Zemanek** was King. Wrapping up the year with Junior/Senior Prom at Signature of Solon was "Out of this World!" **Alyssa Kristosik** walked away as Prom Queen and **Rob Razzante** was crowned Prom King. After, students continued their night with an amazing paradise themed After Prom put on by the wonderful parents of Mayfield. The United Way group led by **Billy Grimm**, **Megan Sloe**, and **Emily Koran** also had a great year full of car shows, mixers, and fundraisers, raising a total of \$8000 from our school.

The Mayfield area may not breed the largest of athletes; however we definitely have the most heart and will to win for our school. This fall the Mayfield Varsity Soccer team led by **Co-captains Vince Milner**, **Nick Kane**, and **Mark Zemanek** won the District title for the third year running. Winter season sports had quite the year with many titles won. The Varsity Hockey team led by **Captain Jake Wolfe** and **Assistant Captains Ryan Trof** and **Stefan Rood** went on to win the Baron Cup City Championship for the second year in a row and second time in school history. The Varsity Basketball team won their conference for the first time in school history which puts Mayfield "on the map" for basketball. Varsity Wrestling had a terrific team, ending their season with three state placers. Spring sports teams also found success with the girls track team having a phenomenal year winning the district championship.

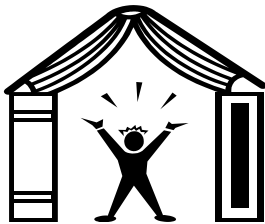

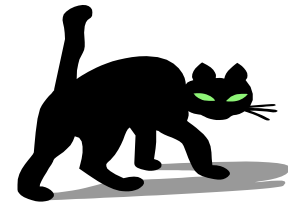

Mayfield High School - The annual **Newsweek** rankings of high schools usually gives high-performing schools a chance to take a bow. 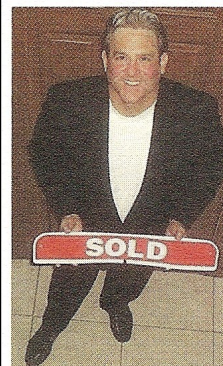
